If you look at the 1<sup>st</sup> picture to the left, you can see 2 of the 5 brothers and sisters graduated from high school this year, with additional children to graduate within the next 2 years. The middle picture has a young man at the left of the group named Gustavo. In 2009, when we opened, Gustavo was doing a year of service at the orphanage. Today, Gustavo is completing his last year of residency to become a doctor. Gustavo is in the picture to the far right. These successes are a result of the exceptional support of many people. **EXCEPTIONAL SUCCESS:** The first picture highlights 5 of our children who graduates from high school this year. We now have a total of 9 high school graduates who are either doing a 2 years of service, or completed their years of service and are now attending college in Monterey Mexico, or in a technical school. The young lady in the middle picture is Leslie. She is from our orphanage and attended her last 2 years of high school in Cuernavaca Mexico at the Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH) High School. The Shinsky Orphanage is a partner with NPH. This year there were 75 high school graduates from the 3 NPH homes in Mexico. Our graduate Leslie was the valedictorian of the entire class. We are so proud of her! The picture on the right is of some of our current children in Matamoros who are progressing in education. Education is the key to the future and a high priority for all of our children.

**Day of Holy Kings (Día de los Santos Reyes)** is another special day for our children and staff. The 3 Kings, John Shinsky, John Duffey, and Chris Duffey deliver candy to our children the night before Christmas.
